Pupils can take part in exciting activities such as climbing, skiing, tobogganing, archery, go-karting and many team-building exercises. All activities are delivered through the medium of Welsh, encouraging pupils to use Welsh naturally in real-life and enjoyable situations. Pupils develop confidence in speaking and listening to Welsh by communicating with instructors and peers throughout the day. The trip strengthens pupils' understanding of Welsh culture and identity.
